Paper Craft

In this bag you will find 2 papercrafts of different levels. 1 is a police box from 20th century Britain. It was used to summon the police and is currently famous in its role in the UK TV series *Doctor Who*. Color, fold, and cut according to the instructions provided. The second papercraft is a model of Big Ben. A famous clock in the UK, it is recently undergoing repairs.

Create Your Own Kilt

A kilt is a garment resembling a knee-length skirt of pleated tartan cloth, traditionally worn by men as part of Scottish Highland dress (now also worn by women and girls). Using the instructions provided create a kilt just for you! I have included real examples of Scottish kilts, as well as some that have been created by

others.

Provided 1 cardstock sheet & strips of colored paper. You will need tape. If you'd like to laminate your kilt NPL does have a laminator. Good luck!

- 1. Take your first piece of paper and fold it in half. Cut the folder paper in half but don't cut all the way through. Leave the last inch or so uncut.
- **2.** Next, cut the two halves in half again so you now have four equal cut sections.
- **3.** Cut one of the sections in half again, so now there are eight equal sections.
- **5.** Unfold the first piece of paper and you now have a page that has evenly spaced slots for weaving.
- **6.** Weave the strips of paper through the slots in the first piece of paper. To achieve a checkerboard formation, start by weaving the first strip of paper under then over the slots. For the next strip of paper, alternate the pattern. Start the second strip by weaving under then over. You can cut some of the strips even narrower and place them on top of each other (see example below)
- **7.** When you have finished weaving, fold the ends of the strips to the back and tape them down with adhesive tape.
