## Stained Glass Cookies


#### Ingredients:

- Sugar Cookie mix, or your favorite sugar cookie recipe!
- Hard Candy (Jolly Ranchers, Lifesavers, etc.)
- 1. Prepare the sugar cookie dough according to the instructions. Chill in the refrigerator for about an hour.
- Roll the dough out on a silicone baking mat or baking paper. Cut
  out the shapes of your cookies. Then on the inside of each cookie,
  use a smaller cookie cutter or knife to cut out an inside shape. (Try
  stars or dreidels for Hanukkah, check the back for pictures).
- 3. Place the hard candy of your choice into a small plastic bag, and use a heavy jar or container to crush the candy into small pieces.
- Place the cookies on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
   Add the crushed candy into the empty space inside each cookie.
   Bake according to instructions. Let cool before removing from tray.

## Star of Pavid

#### Ingredients:

- 1 cup chocolate baking chips
- Small pretzel sticks
  - \* Sprinkles
- 1. Melt the chocolate in a small bowl.
- 2. You will need 6 pretzels for each star. Dip each pretzel into the chocolate and then assemble to form a star. Assemble on wax paper, and add sprinkles on top. (check back for pictures.)
- 3. Allow to set until hardened, or place in the freezer to speed things up.
