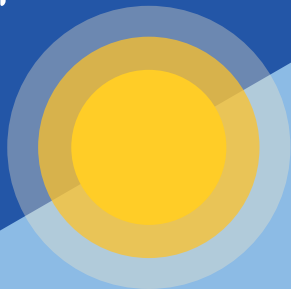


Reading can be one of the many fun activities children choose to fill their summer time. And research has shown it is also much more!
