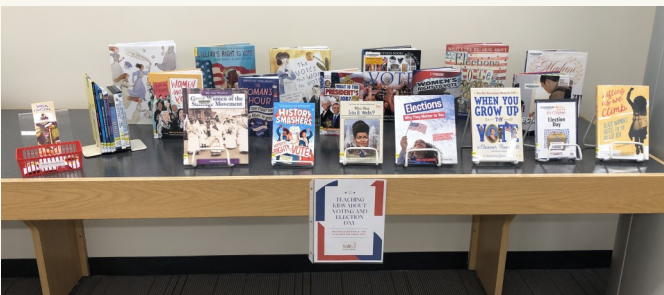
Register. Make a plan. Vote.
